GALATZÓ - SES SINIES

Start: Cases de Galatzó

Finish: Ses Sínies Dorf mit schiffsförmigen Bauten

Distance: 8.180 m

Altitude: 181 / 320 m

Estimated time required: 1 h 30 min

Difficulty: Easy

Heritage sites on the route: The houses of Galatzó, the Sa Cometa spring, the lime kilns of Na Llaneres, the lime kiln of Comellar de Sa Cova Rotja, ethnographic site linked to the charcoal industry of ses Sínies, the Ses Sínies well, the viewpoint at Ses Sínies, the naviform structure at Ses Sínies

Description: A route noteworthy for its outstanding landscapes, archaeology and ethnography. It begins among the houses of the country estate and continues in a northerly direction parallel to the Galatzó torrent, ending in the area of Ses Sínies. After walking for just over an hour we find ourselves in traditional farmland featuring typically Mediterranean plants such as cabbages, reeds, Montpellier rock roses and shrubs, pine trees and wild olives. We can observe ethnographic landmarks such as qanats (underground irrigation channels), lime kilns, charcoal miners' huts, fountains, and so on, as well as a rest area and the settlement of Ses Sínies, archaeological ruins dating from the Bronze Age. At the end of the excursion a more difficult route begins leading to La Mola de S'Esclop.
